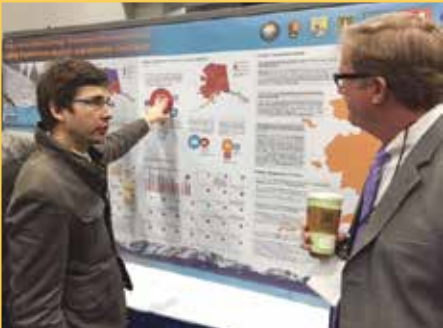


## SUBMIT YOUR IDEA

### FOR A POSTER SESSION



The TRB Managed Lanes Committee (AHB35) and IBTTA invite you to submit applications for a poster session display at the IBTTA/TRB Joint Symposium on Managed Lanes and AET. This session will provide a unique opportunity to interact with an international audience in sharing experiences of your projects and research that feature transportation pricing and/or managed lanes.



The Joint Poster Session will highlight new research and lessons learned in planning, implementing and operating congestion pricing and managed lane projects. The objective is to share and discuss research findings and case studies that identify best practices for implementing successful projects.

While all relevant abstracts will be considered for this Symposium, the committee is especially seeking papers that address the following topics:

- The Future of Managed Lanes and Congestion Pricing
- Managed Lanes and Transit Working Together
- Enforcement deployments or pilots enforcement opportunity cost-benefit cost analyses
- Big data in tolling and managed lanes and performance reporting issues
- Managed Lanes as a Test Bed for Autonomous and Connected Vehicles

#### ABOUT THE POSTER SESSION

The poster session will be included with the exhibitors during a scheduled portion of the Joint Symposium. This will allow a lot of opportunities for interacting with attendees, particularly for discussion of research and technical material.

Applications will be reviewed by a working group composed of Members and Friends of the Managed Lanes Committee. Applicants will be notified by May 1, 2017, whether or not their proposal has been accepted for the Poster Session.
