The independent government agency was created in 2002 to design a modern, regional transportation network for Central Texas. The Mobility Authority's current and future projects are key elements in a carefully planned, multi-modal transportation system designed to meet the diverse mobility needs of this fast-growing region. Mike has been with the

Mobility Authority since its inception and has overseen the development of their first project, 183A in Williamson County. 183A is one of the first projects in the country to transition to all-electronic, cashless toll collection. The Mobility Authority recently opened the 290 Toll (Manor Expressway) project, and is constructing Express Lanes on MoPac (Loop 1). The Mobility Authority is also collaborating with regional transportation entities to study six other planned expressways across Central Texas.
